(inline with our infectious illness policy).</p> <p>If a child becomes unwell with symptoms of coronavirus while in the setting and needs direct personal care until they can return home, then disposable gloves, a disposable apron and a fluid-resistant surgical face mask should be worn by the supervising adult if a distance of 2 metres cannot be maintained. If a risk assessment determines that there is a risk of splashing to the eyes, for example from coughing, spitting, or vomiting, then eye protection should also be worn.</p> <p>If the child needs to use the bathroom while waiting to be collected, the bathroom will be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else.</p>

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To prevent the spread of the Covid virus			Once the child or member of staff has left the setting, settings should follow Cleaning of non-healthcare settings to ensure areas they have been in are disinfected and any PPE and other waste is disposed of safely.	
To prevent the spread of the Covid virus	Children/adults	Low	all staff and children who are attending a childcare setting will have access to a test if they display symptoms of coronavirus, and are encouraged to get tested in this scenario. When the child or staff member tests negative, they can return to the setting and the fellow household members can end their self-isolation. If the child or staff member tests positive, Pre school management would contact public health england for advice as to whether the rest of their immediate group within their setting should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 14 days.
